Fictional diary of 13-year-old Anastasia, daughter of Czar Nicholas covers the last five years of her life. She records the privileged life of the royal family before World War I and the tragic events that befell them between January 1914 and May 1918. For grades 5-8. 2008.

PL000218 *Angel Creek* by Linda Howard. 9 hours.

For five years after her father died, Dee Swann held on to Angel Creek valley and her independence. The homestead was hers, and she vowed no one else would ever own it--or her. PL 000212 *Autumn Lover* by Elizabeth Lowell. 11 hours.

Returning to her Wyoming ranch at the Civil War's end, Elyssa Sutton finds it picked bare by scavengers and coveted by determined men. Yet the proud young woman vows never again to abandon her Ruby Mountain home, though it means enlisting the aid of a dark and dangerous stranger who lives for revenge alone.

McCaleb discovers, rather than a simple robbery gone bad, a taunting serial killer. Some violence and strong language. Bestseller.

PL000221 *Bone By Bone* by Carol O'Connell. 11.5 hours. Discover a world of heroes and villains, suspense and intrigue. This riveting and comprehensive collection brings together some of the best crime writing of all time. Includes Ruth Rendell, Graham Green, and many more.

But when he spots Boyle in Malaysia eight years later, Holloway discovers a labyrinthine conspiracy involving the Freemasons and Thomas Jefferson. Violence and strong language. Bestseller. 2006.

PL000140 *Boom! Voices of the Sixties* by Tom Brokaw. 18 hours.

Television anchorman Tom Brokaw conducted dozens of personal interviews with baby boomers to document the decade of the 1960s. Includes reminiscences about the political, cultural, and socioeconomic meaning of the era and the changes that occurred. Some strong language. Bestseller. 2007.

PL000224 *Boys Will Be Boys* by Jeff Pearlman. 14 hours.

They were America's Team--the high-priced, high-glamour, high-flying Dallas Cowboys of the 1990s, who won three Super Bowls and made as many headlines off the field as on it. Led by Emmitt Smith, Deion "Prime Time" Sanders, and Hall of Famers Troy Aikman and Michael Irvin, the Cowboys rank among the greatest of all NFL dynasties.

PL000137 *Bridge to Terabithia* by Katherine Paterson. 4 hours.

PL000035 *The Broker* by John Grisham. Abridged. 6 hours.

The CIA pressures lame-duck president Arthur Morgan into releasing jailed lobbyist Joel Backman, who obtained stolen satellite software six years before. The Agency spirits Backman to Italy to use him for bait, leaks his whereabouts--and waits to see who kills him. Some violence and some strong language. Bestseller. 2005.

PL000073 *Brother Odd* by Dean Koontz. 12 hours.

In this sequel to *Forever Odd*, Odd Thomas leaves Pico Mundo and retreats to a mountain monastery. Hoping to restore his spirit at a religious community and school for abandoned children, he instead encounters a sinister enemy. Some descriptions of sex, some violence, and some strong language. 2006.

PL000180 *Bourne Ultimatum* by Robert Ludlum. Abridged. 3.5 hours.

David Webb, alias Jason Bourne, is a husband, father, and college professor. When two of his friends receive telegrams, supposedly from Bourne, and then witness a murder, they realize that Bourne's nemesis, Carlos, is the culprit. Webb must once again assume the role of Bourne and confront Carlos. Strong language and some descriptions of sex. Bestseller.

PL000131 *Bungalow 2* by Danielle Steel. 10.5 hours.

California housewife and freelancer Tanya Harris receives her big break--the chance to write a major Hollywood screenplay. Leaving her family, Tanya heads to the Beverly Hills Hotel and mingles with stars until another surprise opportunity comes along. Bestseller. Some strong language and some descriptions of sex. 2007.

PL000018 *Busting Vegas* by Ben Mezrich. Abridged. 6 hours.

He played in casinos around the world, with a scheme to make himself rich--but it would nearly cost him his life. Semyon Dukach and his fellow MIT students were taking classes during the week, but on weekends they were unstoppable on the casino floor.

PL000222 *The Call of the Canyon* by Zane Grey. 7.75 hours.

Carley Burch leaves her high society life in New York City to reclaim her fiancé, Glen, who had moved to the Wild West. She braves fierce ruffians, brutal elements, and lack of civilization in order to convince him to return to New York.

Now, the adult Tory returns home to South Carolina, where her psychic ability to "see" the past and the future puts her in mortal danger. Some descriptions of sex, some violence, and some strong language. Bestseller.

PL000075 *The Cat Ate My Gymsuit* by Paula Danziger. 2.75 hours.

Thirteen-year-old Marcy feels unattractive and insecure because she is fat and flat-chested, and has acne. She also hates her father and her school. Ms. Finney, the new English teacher, helps Marcy gain confidence. When the principal fires Ms. Finney because of her unorthodox teaching methods, Marcy helps lead the fight to have her teacher reinstated. Grades 6-9 and older. 1974.

PL000191 *The Cat Who Blew the Whistle* by Lilian Jackson Braun. 6.5 hours.

With the help of investors, train-buff Floyd Trevelyan has turned an old steam locomotive and private railroad cars into the Lumbertown Party Train. But the morning after the initial run of the train, Trevelyan is missing, and the Lumbertown Credit Union (of which he is president) is closed. The police seem to think there is a connection. But Jim Qwilleran, along with his cats Yum Yum and Koko, thinks the police are on the wrong track.

PL000185 *The Cat Who Came to Breakfast* by Lilian Jackson Braun. 7 hours.

Jim Qwilleran's latest adventure takes him and his cats, Koko and Yum Yum, to Maine's Pear Island, known to the natives as Breakfast Island, to investigate some unusual accidents. Qwill has high tea with royalty as he and his cats solve both a century old disappearance and the cause of the twentieth century "accidents." Bestseller. 1994.

PL000010 *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* by Roald Dahl. 7 hours.
Charlie Bucket's tour of Mr. Willy Wonka's Chocolate Factory sends him on adventures beyond his wildest dreams. For grades 4-7. 1984.

PL000076 *Charlotte's Web* by E.B. White. 3.75 hours.
A little girl who can talk with animals is devoted to Wilbur, the foolishly smug pig, and Charlotte, the beautiful gray spider, who works to save Wilbur's life. A sensitive story for children of all ages as well as adults. Grades 3-6. Newbery Honor Book. 1953.

PL000200 *China Lake* by Meg Gardiner. 12 hours.
Evan Delaney is shocked to learn that her ex-sister-in-law, Tabitha, has joined the Remnant, a religion with a dangerous and fanatical following. What is more alarming is that the unstable young mother plans to regain custody of her son and disappear with him into the fold of the church. She has the Remnant on her side, and they'll do anything it takes -- including murder.

PL000194 *Christmas Letters* by Debbie Macomber. 5 hours.

PL000012 *DaVinci Code* by Dan Brown. 16 hours.

Professor Robert Langdon investigates the crime scene of the Louvre's murdered curator. Joining him is French cryptologist Sophie Neveu. The clues left behind pit two Catholic societies against each other in the search of the Holy Grail. Some violence and some strong language. 2003.

PL000231 *Dead Irish* by John Lescroart. 10 hours.

Ex-cop Dismas Hardy, currently a bartender, unofficially investigates his friend Eddie Cochran's apparent suicide. Dismas, coping also with unresolved feelings for his ex-wife, identifies possible murder motives and examines the role of Eddie's compassionate, conflicted priest. Strong language, some explicit descriptions of sex, and some violence. 1989.

PL000167 *Deal Breakers* by Harlen Coben. 9 hours.

Sports agent Myron Bolitar is poised on the edge of the big time. So is Christian Steele, a rookie quarterback and Myron's prized client.
